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From the Firefly Coffeehouse in historical downtown Oregon, you can quickly get to Ann Miller's stained glass studio (#12) where you can also see Carol Giffin's fused glass work (#11) and Joella Miller's intricate chainmaille jewelry (#13). Head west on A to Ann Kleckner's home studio (#30). You are almost there when you crest a large hill. Ann's studio is at the bottom of the hill. Ann creates unique fused glass pieces. You will also find Mary Doers (#29) who molds PMC Clay to make unique inclusions in her jewelry, and local Oregon photographer Mark Buehl (#28). Head south to see the extraordinary art of Dan Ott (#32), or continue on to enjoy the beautiful flower gardens at the home of photographer Dick Dornaus (#10). Then on to the Wood Cycle, where master wood worker Paul Morrison (#9) takes you through the entire cycle from tree to furniture. Next, Prairie Arts Metalworks' Rich Fizzell (#8) will show you how he uses everything from scrap iron to his silo to create useful works of art. Bernie Lynch's art business (#31) is called "closer views" for a reason; you'll discover some truly amazing images from nature. Follow County A heading west to William Wolberg's home studio (#7), to enjoy the serene setting that inspires his photographs.
